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State Propositions

Prop 141**YES**

A YES vote would prohibit government from imposing taxes or fees based on vehicle miles traveled.

Prop 142**YES**

A YES vote would prohibit government from requiring preferential treatment or discrimination based on race or ethnicity.

Prop 144**YES**

A YES vote would change election laws to include citizen-only voting and a government-issued ID requirement.

Prop 316**YES**

A YES vote would prohibit local government from imposing or increasing a tax on food items without voter approval and cap the tax rate at 2%.

Prop 317**YES**

A YES vote would declare drug cartels to be terrorist organizations.

Prop 318**YES**

A YES vote would prohibit schools from allowing individuals to use private spaces not designated for their biological sex.

Prop 319**YES**

A YES vote would prohibit government from using traffic photo enforcement without voter approval.

Prop 320**YES**

A YES vote would require certain school districts to spend at least 60% of their budget on direct instruction.
